8th March



Privately owned boats can be used by a single household /bubble where participants remain outside except to access toilets, for safety reasons or to navigate



A boat owner can conduct essential maintenance specifically for safety related issues to ensure their boat is safe to use (seaworthy)



Toilet facilities may open subject to Covid-19 secure procedures and cleaning regimes



Self-contained individual shower/bathroom facilities may open subject to Covid-19 secure procedures and cleaning regimes

29th March



Boat owners are permitted to perform general boat maintenance



All privately owned boats can be used by groups of up to 6 people or 2 households where participants remain outside except to access toilets, for safety reasons or to navigate



All privately owned boats can be used both inside and outside by a single household/bubble

❖ No Overnight Stays

❖ Minimise Travel

12th April



Overnight stays on boats permitted for single households/support bubble



Food and drink can be served outside (rule of 6 or 2 households applies). Seated table or takeaway service only



Non essential retail can open

❖ Minimise Travel

17th May



All privately owned boats can be used by groups of up to 6 people or 2 households both inside and outside



Shared sanitary facilities may open subject to Covid-19 secure procedures and cleaning regimes



Indoor social and catering areas may open (rule of 6 or 2 households applies). Seated table service only

21st June
